

Teacher Tekhaya, says: Bafana is well organised & when we are doing colouring, he is very neat. He is very creative in artwork, likes listening to stories & is very good at dramatising stories. Bafana sometimes pretends to be a teacher during free play. He is a happy boy with good manners."

Anna Low, SHAMBA Director, says: "It's fitting to feature Bafana in our first newsletter as he is our longest attending pupil. He was 2 - almost 3 - when he started & I remember him crying all morning. He quickly became a confident young boy!"

Bafana started at The Bright Future Preschool in 2011. He is in the oldest group now and is an 'Elephant'. He will be going to primary school next year. Bafana's gogo (grandma) has applied for place for him at the local Primary School.

Last term, lessons were planned around the letters F, I & K. Bafana learnt about e.g.:

- Animals: frogs, 'Joey's', kittens,
- Body parts: face, fingers, joints & knees.
- Countries: France, Jordan & Kenya.
- Jobs: firefighters & journalists.
- He tasted jelly, ketchup & kiwi fruit.
